## NASC publishes annual safety report

NASC members recorded 113 accidents and injuries on site during 2018 – one incident for every 150 operatives.

The figure was revealed in the NASC 2019 Safety Report, which documents and analyses accident and injury statistics for its full contracting members annually. The 113 injuries recorded means that more than 99% of all NASC member operatives went through 2018 accident and injury-free. There were also no operative fatalities last year, for the sixth consecutive year. The most common cause of accidents and injuries were slips, trips and fall on the same level – representing more than 43% of all accidents reported.

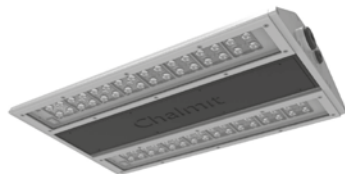
